

OUTCOMES MATTER



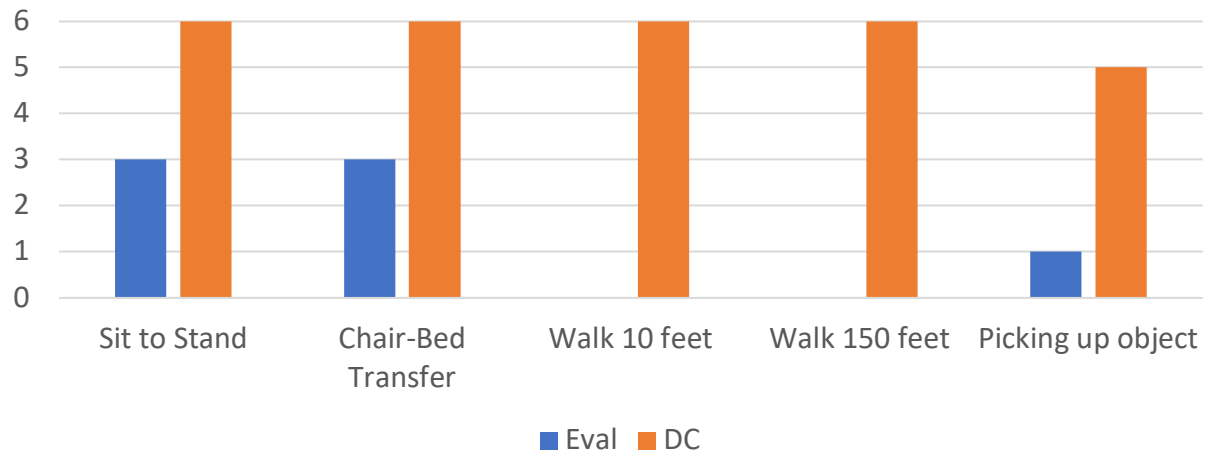
Mrs. Joann Jones underwent a left hip replacement on February 5th, 2024. After about a week of therapy she had to be re-admitted into the hospital for complications with the left hip prosthesis. After a second surgery Mrs. Jones returned to Pecan Bayou to continue therapy with the goal of discharging back home.

She received both Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy during her stay. PT focused on bed mobility, transfers, lower extremity strength, standing activity, and gait. OT focused on upper extremity strength, toileting/hygiene, dressing, and grooming.

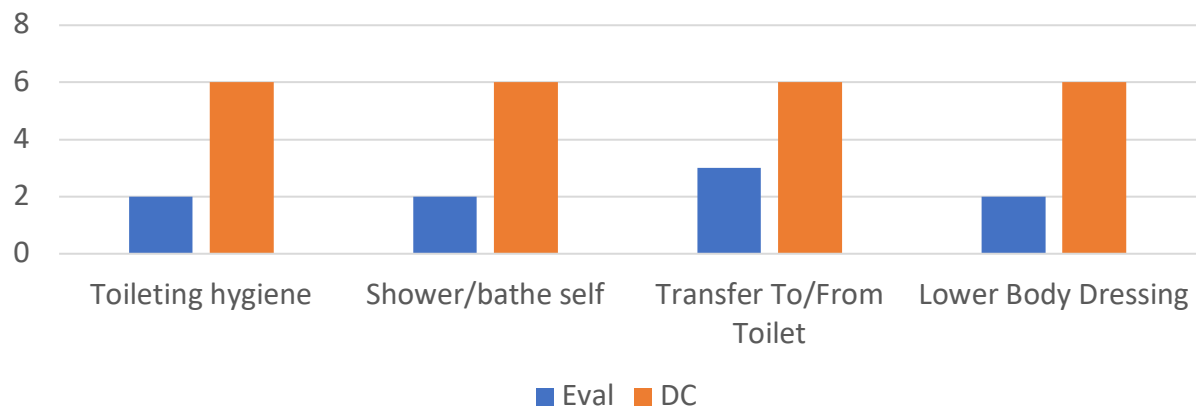
During her stay Mrs. Jones showed progress with all tasks. She progressed from requiring assistance with transfers to performing them on her own in her room. She returned from the hospital with a partial weight bearing status on her left leg which initially limited progress with gait. However, after some time she was able to start putting more weight on her left leg and began showing progress with walking. She started walking on her own in her room and in the hallways with her walker. She also became independent with all self-care tasks.

Mrs. Jones did well with her rehabilitation and walked out of the facility when she discharged home on April 11, 2024.

MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent

Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper

05- Setup or clean-up assistance

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

04 - Supervision or touching assistance

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

03 - Partial/moderate assistance

Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.

02 - Substantial/maximal assistance

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

01 - Dependent

Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
